The _____ Plague

Exodus 12:12-13 *On that night I will pass through the land of Egypt and strike down every firstborn male, both man and beast, and I will execute judgment against all the gods of Egypt. I am the LORD. 13*The blood on the houses where you are staying will be a sign; when I see the blood, I will pass over you. No plague will fall on you to destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.

Exodus 12:14 *And this day will be a memorial for you, and you are to celebrate it as a feast to the LORD, as a permanent statute for the generations to come. 15*For seven days you must eat unleavened bread. On the first day you are to remove the leaven from your houses.

John 13:21-25 *Jesus was troubled in his spirit, and testified, "Truly, truly, I say to you, one of you will betray me." 22*The disciples looked at one another, uncertain of whom he spoke. 23*One of his disciples, whom Jesus loved, was reclining at table at Jesus' side, 24*so Simon Peter motioned to him to ask Jesus of whom he was speaking. 25*So that disciple, leaning back against Jesus, said to him, "Lord, who is it?"*

Exodus 12:3, 5-7 *Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth day of this month each man must select a lamb for his family, one per household....⁵Your lamb must be an unblemished year-old male.... ⁶You must keep it until the fourteenth day of the month, when the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel will slaughter the animals at twilight. ⁷They are to take some of the blood and put it on the sides and tops of the doorframes of the houses where they eat the lambs.*

John 12:1-2,9,12 *Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, the hometown of Lazarus, whom He had raised from the dead. ²So they hosted a dinner for Jesus there. Martha served, and Lazarus was among those reclining at the table with Him...⁹ Meanwhile a large crowd of Jews learned that Jesus was there. And they came not only because of Him, but also to see Lazarus, whom He had raised from the dead...¹² The next day the great crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem.*

Zachariah 9:9 *See, your King comes to you, righteous and victorious, humble and riding on a donkey.*
